

1 even greater impetus to the idea that they should not
2 have even a measure of control over the institution.
3 Therefore, although I am reluctant and concerned very
4 much about the effect of the double provision, I will
5 vote for the motion.

6 Any further discussion? Dr. Bard, will you
7 close the debate?

8 DR. BARD: I have but this statement to make,
9 Mr. Chairman. First, I agree very strongly with your
10 last statement, namely, to leave out the State colleges
11 from this Constitution, no matter how you may feel in
12 regard to the first motion which we have just passed, it
13 would do serious damage to the growth of the State colleges
14 at this time particularly. Most State Constitutions
15 that deal with higher education include both elements,
16 the University and the State colleges. To leave them out
17 would be very wrong.

18 Secondly, it is important for us to recognize
19 that the tripartite system of higher education is begin-
20 ning to be deeply recognized in the State of Maryland as
