THE CHAIRMAN: That is exactly why I expressed concern, because Mr. Miller had asked if the Section was open to further amendment, and I said it was. This motion goes to the complete substitution of a different provision for the motion, for the provisions that have been adopted. I very frankly am uncertain and --

MR. MILLER: I might say, Mr. Chairman, I am uncertain, too, as to the parliamentary. But it seems to me when the Chair has given me a ruling that was with this very thing in mind I asked if it would be open to change and was told Yes, and there was not a voice raised in opposition. It would seem to me that irrespective of what might be the irregular rule on this, that it would at least be operating as a distinct reversal as far as what the Chair told me.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Case?

MR. CASE: Mr. Chairman, I think the time has come as far as this University of Maryland thing is concerned, to stop playing games. Thirteen people on this Commission have voted for the limited degree of autonomy for the University as suggested in Number 3 of
