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the Committee's recommendation. Now, the effect of the Scanlan motion would be to completely reverse that, completely reverse it, and to put the University of Maryland right back where it was before we voted. Now,

one of the people who voted for the autonomy of the University had to leave his note here, but has --

THE CHAIRMAN: Has anybody left?

MR. CASE: Mr. Smith has left, and I think this is a monstrous thing. We are all grownup people here, and the majority of the Commission has voted for it.

MR. MILLER: As a matter of personal privilege, I am not playing games, and I asked the Chair for a ruling, and I got it. I don't think it ought to be changed just because the ruling satisfied me, but if it hadn't been for that, I would have offered a motion to substitute this proposal.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Miller, the Chair does not think you are planing games or have any desire to think so, nor does the Commission think so.

MR. SYKES: Mr. Chairman, I would suggest that
