

1 subject to any motion to amend or substitute other
2 language and still remains subject to those motions. If
3 the motion had originally arisen on a question of approv-
4 ing the Section, the ruling may have been different,
5 but it seems to me that the motion is therefore authorized.

6 MRS. BOTHE: I would like to appeal the rul-
7 ing and point out the practice of this Commission has
8 been not to entertain motions in favor of the Committee's
9 recommendation, but to let them go as proposed unless
10 a Member proposes deletion or change. It was under those
11 circumstances that the posture of the motion was before
12 this Commission; and for that reason, the vote was very
13 obviously one to retain the Section. It was so under-
14 stood. The Chairman, before the lunch recess, pointed
15 out that the Commission should regard the suggestion of
16 the Chairman and of the Committee in taking its vote on
17 reconsideration. I am sure that every one of us who
18 were here at the time and those who still remain, under-
19 stood when they voted on that motion that they were
20 voting in favor of retention of Section 3 as proposed
21 by the Committee.
