DR. BURDETTE: Your recommendation it seems to me is simply, talking about the Comptroller, he not be mentioned in the Constitution. If you don't mention him in the Constitution, I don't see how you can provide he be appointed by the Governor.

JUDGE ADKINS: I think probably that comment is a valid comment and one of technique. would be glad to have my right hand Power comment on it since he wrote the report.

MR. POWER: What we had in mind in the over-all picture was this. We would not mention the Comptroller specifically by name in the Constitution. There would be, however, a general provision to the effect that the Governor would appoint the heads of all principal departments; assuming then that the Comptroller continues to be the head of a principal
