2 the substitution of a motion like Mr. Scanlan has made
3 when one of the Members of the Commission who was in
4 favor of this has gone, and now Mr. Adkins here who was
5 against it before, is just playing games, and I repeat,
6 we ought to go ahead with what we have done and use any
7 other time we have to debate other things.

8 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Sykes?

9 MR. SYKES: Mr. Chairman, I don't think the
10 problem is as simple as that. I would like to state my
11 position on Mr. Scanlan's amendment. I am going to vote
12 for it, not merely because of the reasons he stated he
13 had, but because I find that his suggestion is clear; it
14 states very clearly what the direction is that we want
15 public education in this State to go, will be, and it
16 states clearly the respective roles of the governing
17 bodies of the State institutions of higher learning and
18 the Legislature. I point out that Section 3 in its
19 original form as recommended by the Committee does not
20 do any of those things. It is itself a two-headed mons-
21 ter, and each head is in irreconcilable conflict with
