I was opposed to extending it to any other State institutions. I am opposed to extending it any further. I believe profoundly that by recognizing the University of Maryland as an autonomous institution, it goes far beyond the interest of education, and in the interest of the welfare of the State as a whole, and for that reason, I favor it and only it being given constitutional autonomy.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion? You ready for the question?

MR. SCANLAN: Mr. Chairman?

THE CHAIRMAN: Just a second. You ready for the question?

Mr. Scanlan?

MR. SCANLAN: I want to say one word. It has been some time since we debated the provisions of original Section 3, and as Mr. Sykes reminded us, during the course of his remarks and to date, Section 3 is at cross purposes with its own.

Mr. Case impliedly assumes that this really grants a great deal of constitutional autonomy, yet the
