

1 gave the Regents general supervision and control. It  
2 was not meant in any way to give the General Assembly  
3 the free hand to give and take away the right of the  
4 University of Maryland's Board of Regents to manage it  
5 independently as Mr. Scanlan's motion would do.

6 THE CHAIRMAN: Now, under our rules, debate  
7 should be finished. Did you want to say anything,  
8 Judge Walsh?

9 JUDGE WALSH: I want to ask Mr. Scanlan, under  
10 his proposal, it is now before the body for action, takes  
11 away or gives autonomy to the University of Maryland.  
12 We have voted on that once, and we voted to give it to  
13 them, and as I understand, what he is proposing to do  
14 is to take it away through the back door.

15 MR. SCANLAN: Judge Walsh, my proposal was  
16 not intended to take away any autonomy from the Univer-  
17 sity of Maryland. It neither makes or mars the autonomy  
18 they enjoy by law.

19 JUDGE WALSH: At the present time they have  
20 autonomy under the statute. They haven't got any auton-  
21 omy under the Constitution.
