gave the Regents general supervision and control. It was not meant in any way to give the General Assembly the free hand to give and take away the right of the University of Maryland's Board of Regents to manage it independently as Mr. Scanlan's motion would do.

THE CHAIRMAN: Now, under our rules, debate should be finished. Did you want to say anything, Judge Walsh?

JUDGE WALSH: I want to ask Mr. Scanlan, under his proposal, it is now before the body for action, takes away or gives autonomy to the University of Maryland. We have voted on that once, and we voted to give it to them, and as I understand, what he is proposing to do is to take it away through the back door.

MR. SCANLAN: Judge Walsh, my proposal was not intended to take away any autonomy from the University of Maryland. It neither makes or mars the autonomy they enjoy by law.

JUDGE WALSH: At the present time they have autonomy under the statute. They haven't got any autonomy under the Constitution.
