

1 primarily for the use of the Constitutional Convention,
2 as to our reasons for recommending or not recommending
3 certain things. This is one of the most important matters
4 on which we will make a recommendation. We are drafting
5 both the provisions, that is, for bicameral as well as
6 unicameral legislation, recognizing it is a matter of
7 considerable doubt or a matter of which there is consider-
8 able controversy, and we should have something more than
9 a mere vote.

10 MRS. FREEDLANDER: A point of information.
11 In order to get unicameralism on the floor, would an
12 amendment to the motion be in order that the Commission
13 recommend a unicameral Legislature?

14 THE CHAIRMAN: I don't think it is necessary.
15 I think you can tell by the vote on this. It is a very
16 narrow issue.

17 Mr. Bond?

18 MR. BOND: Wasn't there a considerable discus-
19 sion of this point at Easton?

20 THE CHAIRMAN: Not the discussion, but whether
21 the Commission should recommend one or the other. There
