after much soul-searching and represents to some extent
a change of position since this Commission initially
met back in June of 1965. I am going to vote for
unicomeralism, because I feel that by the redraft of
this Constitution where we have strengthened the local
government and placing a great deal of responsibility
at that level, the Legislature is going to have the responsibility of clarifying and redefining the lines
between the local subdivisions and the Legislature itself.
Where you can inject into that process a

degree of clarification of the responsibility of the General Assembly to the local subdivisions and to the electorate, I think a very real forward step will have been taken insofar as representative government is concerned. Along that line, by reason of the fact that I believe firmly that a unicameral Legislature will clarify, I am changing my vote and voting for it.
