Consitutional Convention. I think that the service we can perform here is voting our own conscience on what we regard as the merits of the question without regard to any attempt at prognosticating what is and what isn't acceptable to the majority of the people. I personally feel, for reasons which I won't repeat, that we can do the greatest service by stating that it is the recommendation of this body after considering the question on its merits, that we have a unicameral Legislature as a means of bringing into being a new form of government which looks forward rather than embalm the bicemeral Legislature which is a fossil of an era now departed merely on the theory that maybe we won't be able to explain properly

I agree with Mr. Mindel that actually if this
Constitution as it finally comes out, is submitted to
the people as a collection of dry, legalistic workings
of existing language, it won't have as good a chance of
passage as if there is a little of what I might be permitted to call schmaltz or sex appeal in it, and I think
this unicameral provision is something if properly explained

to the people what we are trying to do.
