

1 electorate. Many times the education is received too  
2 late to be effective in the House of origin. It is not,  
3 however, too late to become effective in the second  
4 House, whichever it may be. I think there is a very  
5 strong vested interest in having as wide dissemination  
6 of pending legislation as possible. I do not think that  
7 can be achieved by the unicameral system.

8 With those three reasons, I would urge we  
9 adopt the Committee's recommendation.

10 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Martineau?

11 MR. MARTINEAU: I would like to speak in favor  
12 of the unicameral Legislature and looking at the same  
13 facts as Judge Adkins does, I come to the opposite con-  
14 clusion.

15 First of all, I would like to address myself  
16 to Dr. Jenkins' suggestion that although he is in favor  
17 of unicameralism, he doesn't think the people are ready  
18 for it, and he would vote against it. I think that  
19 would be a serious mistake. My own personal observations  
20 have been that what little polling I have done, private  
21 polling, is that people are much more ready to take
