electorate. Many times the education is received too late to be effective in the House of origin. It is not, however, too late to become effective in the second House, whichever it may be. I think there is a very strong vested interest in having as wide dissemination of pending legislation as possible. I do not think that can be achieved by the unicameral system.

With those three reasons, I would urge we adopt the Committee's recommendation.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Martineau?

MR. MARTINEAU: I would like to speak in favor of the unicameral Lagislature and looking at the same facts as Judge Adkins does, I come to the opposite conclusion.

First of all, I would like to address myself to Dr. Jenkins' suggestion that although he is in favor of unicameralism, he doesn't think the people are ready for it, and he would vote against it. I think that would be a serious mistake. My own personal observations have been that what little polling I have done, private polling, is that people are much more ready to take
