unicameralism than we might suspect, and I think this is
time when we should vote our convictions. This is
merely a recommendation, and we should vote what is
appropriate.

I might say in connection with that, I think that if we, if the Constitutional Convention adopts a bicsmeral Legislature, I think we will have that for the next one hundred years. It is not a quistion of giving the reapportionment bicameral Legislature a time to see if it works, and if it doesn't work, we can change to a unicameral. If we adopt it now, we will always have it. If we adopt the unicameral Legislature now, and it doesn't work out, it would not be very difficult to change back to a bicameral Legislature.

Another point, it seems to me that those who argue that the small Counties should favor a bicameral Legislature because they will have greater protection there, I think are making a great mistake. Take, for example, my own County of Carroll, we are a smaller County included in a district of a number of other Counties and do not have the population to elect that senator,
