favor of the unicameral legislation.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Haile?

MR. HAILE: An argument can also be based on experience as well as reason, and I would like to state my experience with a unicameral Legislature.

The duty of this group here, this Commission, is that we come from different backgrounds and experiences.

Mine has been for 600,000 people for the past ten years.

Now, the most serious argument against unicameral Legislature is that unwise legislation might get through whereas if there are two Houses, it would be caught up.

From experience, however, it seems that there are five things working with unicomeral which minimizes the passage of unwise legislation; first, the executive veto; second, there is a referendum reserved to the people; thirdly is the press and publicity and the molding through that of public opinion which works directly on unicomeral legislation, and fourth is the Judiciary, which strikes down any illegal legislation, and fifth is the power of the unicomeral Legislature to amend many laws which have proven unwise.
