go ahead and talk and try to be influential but go about their business because they can't afford to be in the Legislature, it doesn't have the attractiveness for their talents. (We,:, and this is getting back to the matter of population, we are going to become more and more an urban nation. Within another twenty years, 70 per cent of our population will reside in suburban and urban areas. This means there is going to be smaller and smaller vote, I think, representing the territories as such.

Where do we get the greater strnegth for those people who don't have the vote of the Legislature? It is through a strong local, district or regional government who would be able to have its proper representation in the Legislature, because it has to be concerned with areas. If we take a whole perspective of where we are involved, we need to have a body that can take a stronger look at the legislation, be able to introduce half as much legislation as a bicameral Legislature will do and would be able to have certain procedures that actually will provide a closer look at the legislation that goes
