MR. BROOKS: That is right. That is prior to

Perhaps the easiest way to reduce the cost of the legislative system if all of these measures are taken would be, rather than to reduce the representation of any segment of the State in both Houses, to have a maximum amount of representation by having the maximum number of legislative districts and yet the minimum number of legislators which suggest a unicameral system and eliminating one House altogether with its overlapping representation. There is a great deal to commend it, and tertainly enough so that it should be considered by a constitutional convention.

MR. BOND: I would like to ask Mr. Brooks a question. On our research, you said there were only a certain percentage of conference committees. Is it not true your research did not disclose the great number of joint committees which investigated problems pressing to the State and took the problem back to both Houses? You show nothing about joint committees of the Legislative Council or of the two Houses that worked on the problem.
