

1 maybe more expensive to give up what I think we have had
 2 for such a long time, that is not a good reason. I know
 3 that, but you don't run with both feet at the same time,
 4 and my hesitation is to keep what we've got. I am in
 5 favor of having the presentation for any statement at
 6 all that can be made of the virtues of a unicameral
 7 system. My feeling is that the degree of its importance
 8 and on the assumption that I am wrong in my thinking,
 9 I think it ought to be presented to the Convention so
 10 that they can make up their minds. I am just in a posi-
 11 tion where I don't like to give up the thing that I,
 12 at times, had to live with and which I got so much help.

13 THE CHAIRMAN: I would like to state my views
 14 before we take a vote. It seems to me that this is
 15 another of those situations where logic is perhaps at war
 16 with tradition and experience, because it seems to me
 17 that by and large the force of logic and the reasons of
 18 logic are in favor of unicameral Legislature, although
 19 I do not think this is wholly the case.
