pertinent question. It gets into a rather long argument in terms of political philosophies. I suppose to the extent any single individual is given power in a state to do anything you take a step toward totalitarian government. We have taken so many steps in that direction, however that I don't consider this slight additional step any real threat; if there is a threat, I think we have long since crossed the threshold. That is my own theory.

MR. SCANLAN: I would like to add on that point one state where perhaps someone might say people have progressed down the totalitarian road is the state where the attorney general is elected, Alabama. The fact the Attorney General is elected on a different line than the Governor in Alabama hasn't prevented the Governor of Alabama from having his wife succeed him.
