to move in one direction and speak in the other. I moved 1 2 in terms of the Committee vote rather than my own feeling. If you think after I have spoken it will be better for 3 4 another Member of the Committee to speak, I will be glad to do so. Our Committee was very, very sensitively 5 balanced, and each Member of the Committee has spoken 6 7 but the Chairman of the Committee. My vote, like Mr. Eney's is one that is personally sensitively balanced. 8 9 However, the balance weighs, as I would see it, in favor 10 of unicameralism and I shall indicate very briefly why 11 I will vote against this motion, which I made as a 12 Committee Chairman. First, I have had the privilege of spending 13

a good deal of time in Nebraska, and I have had the privil 14 ege of watching the Nebraska Legislature in action. In-15 16 deed, Nebraska is my second State. I lived there ten summers and observed very carefully how the Legislature 17 operates. I think it works efficiently, I think it works 18 19 with dispatch, I think it works economically, and I think 20 it works with a good deal of forethought.
