

1 to move in one direction and speak in the other. I moved  
2 in terms of the Committee vote rather than my own feeling.  
3 If you think after I have spoken it will be better for  
4 another Member of the Committee to speak, I will be glad  
5 to do so. Our Committee was very, very sensitively  
6 balanced, and each Member of the Committee has spoken  
7 but the Chairman of the Committee. My vote, like  
8 Mr. Eney's is one that is personally sensitively balanced.  
9 However, the balance weighs, as I would see it, in favor  
10 of unicameralism and I shall indicate very briefly why  
11 I will vote against this motion, which I made as a  
12 Committee Chairman.

13 First, I have had the privilege of spending  
14 a good deal of time in Nebraska, and I have had the privi-  
15 lege of watching the Nebraska Legislature in action. In-  
16 deed, Nebraska is my second State. I lived there ten  
17 summers and observed very carefully how the Legislature  
18 operates. I think it works efficiently, I think it works  
19 with dispatch, I think it works economically, and I think  
20 it works with a good deal of forethought. I have noted,
