

1 of three contiguous Counties, may be changed with the  
2 majority of the voters of the State voting thereon.

3 THE CHAIRMAN: May I suggest to you that you need  
4 in connection with it another change, Mr. Clagett, and  
5 that is something to indicate that what you are talking  
6 about here is one bill, one act, one law changing the  
7 lines of more than three contiguous Counties. You are  
8 not talking about a situation where the Legislature in  
9 one session may pass six bills, changing separately the  
10 lines of six Counties, is that correct?

11 MR. CLAGETT: That is correct.

12 THE CHAIRMAN: So that, Mr. Sykes, maybe you  
13 can doctor your language a little.

14 MR. SYKES: May be changed by a bill.

15 THE CHAIRMAN: The law is the expression we  
16 are using.

17 MR. SYKES: By a law. By law, would mean --  
18 law could be several, but a law --

19 MR. CLAGETT: I think the word, contiguous,  
20 takes care of that.

21 MR. SYKES: No, they could do it by separate
