of three contiguous Counties, may be changed with the 1 majority of the voters of the State voting thereon. 2 THE CHAIRMAN: May I suggest to you that you need 3 in connection with it another change, Mr. Clagett, and 4 that is something to indicate that what you are talking 5 about here is one bill, one act, one law changing the 6 lines of more than three contiguous Counties. You are 7 not talking about a situation where the Legislature in 8 one session may pass six bills, changing separately the 9 lines of six Counties, is that correct? 10 MR. CLAGETT: That is correct. 11 THE CHAIRMAN: So that, Mr. Sykes, maybe you 12 can doctor your language a little. 13 MR. SYKES: Nay be changed by a bill. 14 THE CHAIRMAN: The law is the expression we 15 16 are using. By a law. By law, would mean 17 MR. SYKES: law could be several, but a law --18 MR. CLAGETT: I think the word, contiguous, 19 20 takes care of that.
