say anything about petition. 1 THE CHAIRMAN: Because the general referendum provision would cover it unless it is passed by -- well, 3 even then --MR. SAYRE: How would this get proposed? 5 THE CHAIRMAN: The bill itself could not take 6 effect under the Constitution unless it were approved at 7 a referendum. 8 MR. SAYRE: And the referendum could not even 9 get to a position unless it had a petition? 10 THE CHAIRMAN: Certainly, it could. You would 11 be providing for it in the bill itself. 12 MR. SAYRE: According to the existing refer-13 endum provision you have, you have to have a petition. 14 This is a separate referendum. THE CHAIRMAN: 15 MR. SAYRE: Does this bill end the referendum 16 provision, then? 17 MR. CLAGETT: In those cases, yes, in those 18 cases where it applies, it would be a built-in referendum, 19 and if the permissive referendum were also applied, it 20 would be two referendums, a State as a whole, and of the 21
