

1 THE CHAIRMAN: That would be the Anne Arundel  
2 County.

3 MR. CASE: I think there was some misinforma-  
4 tion given out here when Mr. Della asked in the case he  
5 proposed whether it would be the combined vote of every-  
6 body or just the vote of the area to be transferred.

7 THE CHAIRMAN: I think it is a question of  
8 doubt. Mr. Clagett answered the question on the basis  
9 not that four-fifths of the County was added to the first  
10 County, but that on the basis that two whole Counties  
11 were put together. He read this then as the construction  
12 of a new County.

13 MR. CLAGETT: That is correct.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: And that would come under the  
15 first sentence as written, and it becomes very doubtful.  
16 I don't think it is at all clear.

17 MR. CASE: No, none of it is, as a matter of  
18 fact.

19 DR. BURDETTE: It seems to me the way this is  
20 worded, if the Legislature provided that Anne Arundel  
21 County would be a part of Baltimore City, herein called
