the County, that the vote thereon would be as Mr. Della suggested in the two combined -- well, I misstated myself. If the transfer were made from Anne Arundel to Baltimore City, that the vote would have to be in Anne Arundel, because the perfectly obvious thing to do, just change the name, then that is a new County, and that would require by the wording of the language a majority in the two parts of the new County which would permit Baltimore City to determine that. Baltimore City would have to change its name to do it.

THE CHAIRMAN: You draw a conclusion I don't follow. The change of a County's name is not the creation of a new County. If you change the name of Baltimore City to something else, Patapsco Heights, I don't think that would be the creation of a new City.

DR. BURDETTE: This would be a tremendous bit of litigation.

THE CHAIRMAN: I quite agree. I wonder if the Committee really cares about it, and if what you really care about is simply that the lines of a County cannot be changed without the consent of the majority of the
