voters who reside within the area proposed to be transferred, regardless of whether this results in simply
adding to one County or creating a new County. I think
this becomes almost a distinction with a difference.

MR. CLAGETT: Not quite, because we really anticipate two entirely different things here. If the Legislature wants to create a new County by consolidating two existing Counties into one, then the thought was that there should be a degree of flexibility that would permit that to be accomplished and using the example that Mr. Della gave us of Baltimore City taking over and Anne Arundel County, and then becoming one County, the Committee's thinking is that we favor the consolidation of Counties. We would like to avoid as much restriction upon that process as possible.

Therefore, the majority resting in Baltimore
City and the majority wanting to acquire Anne Arundel, it
could be accomplished notwithstanding the objections of
Anne Arundel County. If it was going to take less than
all of Anne Arundel County, only a part of it, then we
felt that would be tampering with boundary lines, and we
