except as to the permissiveness of the Legislature deciding whether or not to submit it to referendum.

THE CHAIRMAN: So you don't need anything on that?

MR. SAYRE: Unless we do have it, the Legislature cannot now do it, can they?

THE CHAIRMAN: Why not?

 $$\operatorname{MR}.$$  SAYRE: Under the new proposed Constitution. The only Article we have is on petition.

THE CHAIRMAN. The Legislature can submit a matter to referendum or pass a law. There certainly isn't anything that says you can't in the existing Consitution.

DR. WINSLOW: I thought there was a court case on that that said they couldn't, a Legislature cannot submit the matter to a referendum of the people of the State.

THE CHAIRMAN: If there is, I am not familiar with it. Certainly, unless I am very much wrong, there have been bills that the Legislature has passed and submitted to referendum.
