the majority of the voters in the County would have to
consent or the whole plan would fall?

MR. CLAGETT: That would be the logical text

of it.

MRS. BOTHE: It would be virtually impossible

if some little County desired to stay the way it was? $\text{MR. CLAGETT: There, in clear focus, is the } \\ \text{problem of the Committee.}$

MR. CASE: I would suggest the State has been in existence for a long time and nobody has tried to do that yet.

MR. CLAGETT: And there have been no new Counties since 1867.

MR, DELLA: The reason I raised the point I did was because I am kind of hazy on this, because I was quite young at the time, but when Baltimore City annexed a part of Anne Arundel County, we took in Brooklyn and around through Curtis Bay. The people in Anne Arundel didn't want this, but it was some kind of arrangement worked out with the County Commissioners and people in authority which allowed this to happen. Since that time,
