other political subdivisions are just that. They are not entities of their own, but they are subdivisions of the State that has been granted all the other powers of the Federal Constitution. They are instruments of the State and are not little autonomous governments here, there, and yonder about the countryside. As a result, these should serve the State and its government rather than any particular people within any one existing County. This week I had an opportunity to talk to both Dean Fordham and Dr. Bebout at Rutgers University, and one thing on the proposal that is before you that they both objected to was the proposition set forth in here permitting a referendum of the people to be transferred from one area to enother. They both feel and indicated that it is the general political thought that today, if there is to be any change of boundaries, if there is to be any practical approach, it should be from the standpoint of the State Legislature having total say without referendum on the changes of boundaries. This is the only way to make Counties or other political subdivisions in fact the instrument of the State Government to serve the State
