either legislation or administrative order under the reorganization provisions, which I would assume the Governor would ultimately have, perhaps as a constitutional matter.

MR. CASE: Let me say this. I don't know whether it makes any difference or not, but the Committee on finance, of course, is involved at this time in reviewing the provisions relating to the State budget.

Now this demonstrates the outflow of state funds and the control of those state funds and the protection of them, et cetera. Now up to now the Constitution has been at least somewhat symmetrical in that there is also a control of the inflow of state funds, and I am wondering whether or not it would be desirable to eliminate the latter and continue the former.

MR. CLAGETT: What?

MR. SAYRE: What latter?

MR. CASE: The latter being duties of the Comptroller. Let's expand the discussion a little bit, to the Treasury Department, because the Constitution now says in effect that all moneys, all state moneys shall
