metropolitan area could be hamstrung by the decisions and necessarily the selfish decisions of any voters in any particular segment of the Baltimore metropolitan district.

I hope the problem can be solved on a State wide basis on what is best for the State. I am fully aware of the jealousies, maybe that is the wrong word, of the incompatibility to a degree between Prince Georges and Montgomery Counties, and I think it would be most unfortunate to have the vital interest of the State in the Washington suburban area become the subject of a tussle between those two very substantially populated areas, and it seems to me that this kind of provision does precisely that. We are saying that the State can't solve the Washington problem area, that the Counties have to. This troubles me. I didn't mean to make a speech, but I think this is a tremendously important matter.

MR. SAYRE: Mr. Chairman, I would like to supersede the prior amendment with a substitute motion, The General Assembly may provide by law for organizing
