2 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Clagett?

3 MR. CLAGETT: It boils down to a matter of  
4 philosophy, and here the Committee has tried to recon-  
5 cile a degree of protection for the area beind immediately  
6 and directly affected where less than all of the  
7 Counties are involved, but yet leaving to the Legisla-  
8 ture a degree of flexibility, and if I keep on using  
9 those words, I think you will come to appreciate what  
10 they really mean -- to meet the problems of urban  
11 development and the ultimate necessity of realigning  
12 local subdivisions when and if that day comes. Therefore,  
13 since this proposal does not take into consideration the  
14 compromise that was reached by the Committee after  
15 extended debate, I would have to oppose it and to ask  
16 that we retain what we have accomplished here.

19 question I have you? There is no protection here for
