you analyze it carefully, let's take the first Section where one County is absorbing another County as a whole. Now, this is all taking place in the General Assembly, and where, let us assume now for the example and clarity, Mr. Della's situation, where Baltimore City is absorbing Anne Arundel County. The delegates in Anne Arundel County have an appeal to the Assembly at large for permissive referendum. The Assembly at large, that is number 1, because it is going to require a majority vote of that General Assembly. After that bill passes, the Anna Arundel delegates can marshal the necessory percentage to put that bill to a general referendum of the State at large. Assuming now that the bill passes, the bill will have to contain a referendum built in protecting the area which is being created which will be Baltimore County and Anne Arundel County, the new County. Now, where less than a new County is being created, you have an even greater protection because the built-in referendum which would then be allowed would be that of the particular area which was being moved. So I think we've got here a compromise of protection for the areas and the
