2 DR. JENKINS: Excuse me, Hal, you say about  
3 the portion being moved. But what about that portion  
4 that is not being moved?

5 MR. CLAGETT: Either a part of the State  
6 as a whole, and if they are that much affected, they  
7 can exercise their voice in the State wide referendum.  
8 Again, remember, this is a compromise, and you can really  
9 find -- well, we came up with four separate possibilities  
10 and you can get into about twelve.

11 THE CHAIRMAN: Mrs. Rothe?

12 MRS. BOTHE: It seems to me there is really  
13 no way to have a referendum that would be effective,  
14 that is, a compromise referendum that has a place in the  
15 second paragraph. I don't think there is any means of  
16 providing for a referendum that is going to carry out the  
17 purpose. Either you are going to have the Legislature  
18 with a free hand subject to the permissive referendum,  
19 or you are going to have a situation where the County,  
20 the people involved themselves are going to have to  
21 determine whether they are going to be moved, which means,
