away, you are throwing away any opportunity of solving the basic problem which is the main reason why we are grappling with a new Constitution today. If Justice Holmes was right in saying that the Constitution of the United States doesn't enact Herbert Spencer's social status, it seems to me that it is indisputable that we make a big mistake if we deliberately enact into the Constitution the very kind of parochialism which is strangling our government today, and if you take the biggest problem that we have and say, We won't give you the tools to solve it, and we will insure that you can't solve it. then we have been tinkering pretty uselessly and spending an awful lot of time over refinements in other matters that would be rendered completely superfluous and meaningless.

THE CHAIRMAN: Nr. Martineau?

MR. MARTINEAU: I would like to disagree with what you said before about voting for this being inconsistent with voting in favor of the deletion of the second paragraph? I am in favor of this motion as I state originally on the basis that if you are going to have a
