and not on the other.

JUDGE ADKINS: I think that is a reasonable suggestion.

THE CHAIRMAN: Let's suppose then that we consider for the moment merely the question of whether the Comptroller should be appointed or an elected official, without regard to the question of whether he is a Constitutional officer. Mr. Della.

MR. DELLA: Mr. Chairman, except, I think, the two facets of this one recommendation together and I think before the people would have a clear understanding of what the machinery is going to be in order to make a final vote, they ought to understand what is the thinking of the Commission at least as to the mechanics that are going to be involved in the operation of the Comptroller's office. I think if they get this understood then they can decide whether it would be wise to put the Comptroller's office out of the Constitution or leave it in. That is my personal opinion.

THE CHAIRMAN: I think undoubtedly if you meant by the people other than this Commission, I am
