

1 two existing Counties, then the referendum goes to a
2 majority of the total people in both Counties. That
3 is what it says now. I say that it should be, a majority
4 of the people in each of the Counties involved --

5 MR. SCANLAN: Concurrent majorities?

6 MR. CASE: That is right. To that extent,
7 I have offered a limited amendment to the first sentence.

8 THE CHAIRMAN: I didn't understand your motion
9 then. The way I read the first sentence is that if you
10 create a new County out of part of two existing Counties,
11 the referendum required is that of the people within
12 the new County, that is of the part transferred. It
13 does not require the consent of the remaining part of the
14 old County as written.

15 MR. CASE: As I read it, it requires a
16 majority of the new area to be formed.

17 THE CHAIRMAN: That is right.

18 MR. CASE: My motion says that it requires the
19 concurrent majority of the areas being combined.

20 MR. CLAGETT: You are both talking about the
21 same thing, but let's reduce it to A, B, and C.
