upon the approach of a broad grant of power to the Counties emanating from the Constitution. Now, if that is going to be our approach consistent with that, must be the County and the relationship of it with the cities because the cities are within the geographical boundaries of the County. You can't have two separate and distinct autonomous areas. You've got to have the two with one having some degree of control and direction over the other. It has been the decision and is the recommendation of the Committee that the County shall make provision for the creation of new cities rather than having a potential built-in conflict between the County and the City if the County has a broad grant of power, and the City has a broad grant of power, one from the Constitution and the other from statute. MR. SCANLAN: I don't see how you answered Senator Hoff's question.

THE CHAIRMAN: I think if you will hold the rest of the questions until we get to 11.04, it may be a little clearer.

MRS. BOTHE: Can I ask a question?
