

1 be Thursday night, and we were there until 12:30 that
2 night, and then this Report that I am reading to you now,
3 I read while Mr. Case was giving his Report this morning.
4 So it has a degree of originality. When we hit that one
5 phrase there, it involves this business of regional
6 governments, et cetera, and when we get to that, I dare-
7 say we will be here until tomorrow. It is all very
8 interesting, but somewhere you are going to have to
9 resolve these things as we did and notwithstanding the
10 good suggestions we got from our worthy Chairman, we had
11 a variety in some respects as you will see later.

12 Now, let's move on into Subsection (d), because
13 here is another big area of controversy and one where
14 we debated long and strenuously. Counties, classes of
15 Counties -- based upon population as determined by the
16 most recent United States census, may be provided by law
17 with not more than five classes and not less than three
18 Counties in any one class. No more than one classifi-
19 cation shall be in effect at any one time, but the
20 classifications may be changed at any time.

21 Now, here again, the Committee is seeking to
