(a) the County will have full power except as limited

by the Legislature. There is no constitutional limita
tion on the power to borrow money.

MRS. BOTHE: So they can do what the State

Government cannot do?

THE CHAIRMAN: The difference is, if you didn't

put it in the Constitution, there would be no limitation

on the Legislature. As to political subdivisions, you

do have the limitation.

MRS. BOTHE: But which you may or may not do?

MR. HAILE: It already has a limitation.

The Legislature has limited Counties.

THE CHAIRMAN: You are talking about its

present makeup. We are talking about under the Constitution.

MR. CLAGETT: If it did reenact the same applicable law as a general law, it would impose a restriction.
