Executive Department under the constitution for the Legislature in creating independent boards and commissions, to provide by legislation that the members should be either elected or appointed and if appointed should be or should not be confirmed by the Senate, or do you plan to have in the constitution any kind of a prohibition against such action by the Legislature?

MR. POWER: Again, I think this gets back to the broad problem we are aware of but haven't actually drafted the provision for yet. The general structure we have been thinking/terms of is this: A broad constitutional provision requiring that the heads of all principal departments, or something like that, be appointed by the Governor and serve at the pleasure of the Governor. Another provision, that all other state officials would be appointed and could be removed as provided by law, so the Legislature would have the power to determine how some state officials would be elected or appointed, or how they would come into office and how they could be removed but not the heads of principal departments.
