THE CHAIRMAN: I think another assumption by the Committee, Mr. Clagett, was, was it not, that under 1, the Legislature would probably provide model forms of charters and would say that if a County does not proceed under one of the other ways, it should automatically acquire one of the charters specified by the General Assembly.

MR. CLAGETT:

That is in one of the alternative approaches. Actually, the Committee felt that the limitation of time by which a County shall be required to adopt a charter form would not be excluded in our recommended approach. If it took twelve years for the County to get around to adopting a charter form of government. then it will take the twelve years. There have been various proposals, one of which is that if after four years a County shall have failed to adopt a charter or a form or structure of government to take care of the effective use of the Home Rule powers, then a plan provide
