(f) if the County does nothing it will still have to go to the General Assembly and get a local law passed, for example, if it wants a bond issue, whereas if this

were the law, then the County Commissioners apparently inherently would have the power to do this even though they hadn't adopted a Code or form of government?

That is correct.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Della?

MR. CLAGETT:

MR. DELLA: Mr. Chairman, it seems to me that adopting this proposal or something similar to it, that it would he wise to have a time period in which the Counties could adopt a local Home Rule law, charter government, and in that period of time which would be limited by the Legislature that the Legislature would take care

of their local problems in this time. The reason I make

this statement, there may be and I am not sure this

prevails, there may be some Counties that have County

Commissioners that are doing a fairly decent job as

County Commissioner but maybe the people wouldn't want them to legislate all the laws for the local County as

such.
