Commission, if I understand this proposal correctly, and I suppose perhaps it is not the time to demonstrate a viewpoint, but this worries me very, very much, because as I understand it, it departs from our existing method of charter form of government as we know it in Maryland as applied to municipalities which is seemingly what this is more closely patterned after than anything else.

Now, in municipalities, there is a model

charter and also there is a provision that if an incorporated town doesn't like the model charter, then it can adopt its own charter, but it has to do one of the two. Either it has to adopt its own charter and therefore, and this is voted on by the people, and they know what it is; or they adopt the one in the Code, and everybody can read it. But this proposal I suggest adopts a third method, and that is as Mr. Sykes has pointed out, you do nothing, in which event the County Commissioners exercise these tremendously broad powers without any contract between them and the people, and to me, this is not, this is not proper, and I think that, for example, in the area which I have some slight knowledgeability, I suppose you
