the approval and consent of the County. On dissolution the County must absorb all the assets and obligations of a municipality. In the field of abnegation, the General Assembly has moved it into the local arena. So we have observed here that the General Assembly has been divesting itself of much of its power and transferring that power to the County. That being the process, then it is illogical conclusion to give to the County the determination of whether or not there shall be any new municipalities or what effect the function of the County and the municipality shall be.

THE CHAIRMAN: Judge Adkins?

JUDGE ADKINS: Is the last sentence inconsistent with the prohibition against local legislation, and if so, which controls?

by the County, and the County, if it fails to get the consent of the municipal corporation, may then appeal to the General Assembly; and on the appeal of the County,
