next report we will have some clarified thinking on our part but the questions you are directing are directed to the problem area which we are not prepared to give a definitive answer on. Mr. Chairman, if the Constitution MR, CLAGETT: or your article doesn't provide what shall be the principal departments, what will stop the Legislature from coming along and saying this shall not be a principal department, and therefore, defeating your purpose in having the Governor make the appointment? I would suppose that first of JUDGE ADKINS: all, I think concomitant with the whole problem, and really we are getting outside of the discussion of our report, but concomitant with this whole problem we are thinking in terms of what amounts to a Constitutional recommendation or a Constitutional provision similar to the Hoover reorganization provisions at the Federal level, whereby the Governor can propose reorganization plans subject to being vetoed by the Legislature within some reasonable period of time, so that the impetus

of creating departments would be with the Chief Executive
