

1 MR. CLAGETT: The Committee intended that
2 insofar as any change in the existing charters of municipal
3 corporations, it should be by and with the consent of
4 the County and not merely its dissolution.

5 THE CHAIRMAN: Then Judge Adkins' point is
6 well taken, it seems to me. This could be a conflict
7 with the power of local legislation of Counties.

8 MRS. FREEDLANDER: We raised this very
9 question Thursday night..

10 THE CHAIRMAN: I know it was discussed, and
11 the difficulty is we didn't remember exactly.

12 MRS. FREEDLANDER: And we said in this par-
13 ticular instance although there were some of us who dis-
14 agreed, there would be local legislation. We recognized
15 the inconsistency. We saw no way out and recognized in
16 this particular instance there would be cases at the
17 invitation of the Counties, there would be this dissolu-
18 tion.

19 MR. BROOKS: That it would be approval rather
20 than legislation itself, but it would be only in the
21 mture of withdrawal of existing power.
