MR. CLAGETT: The Committee intended that 2 insofar as any change in the existing charters of municipal 3

corporations, it should be by and with the consent of the County and not merely its dissolution.

THE CHAIRMAN: Then Judge Adkins' point is well taken, it seems to me. This could be a conflict with the power of local legislation of Counties.

MRS. FREEDLANDER: We raised this very question Thursday night...

THE CHAIRMAN: I know it was discussed, and the difficulty is we didn't remember exactly.

MRS. FREEDLANDER: And we said in this particular instance although there were some of us who disagreed, there would be local legislation. We recognized the inconsistency. We saw no way out and recognized in this particular instance there would be cases at the invitation of the Counties, there would be this dissolution.

MR. BROOKS: That it would be approval rather than legislation itself, but it would be only in the mture of withdrawal of existing power.
